Gianni Liti's lab uses genetics and genomics to understand the evolutionary processes that shape natural variation at the population level. He serves as editor in chief of the journal Yeast (Wiley). He received the DuPont Young Professor Award (2015), the Accademia Nazionale dei Lincei "Giovanna Jucci" prize for genetics 2021) and Mortimer's medal (2023). He was elected to the European Molecular Biology Organization (EMBO) member in 2021.
