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Prof. Xin-Qing Zhao received her Ph.D. Degree at Myongji University, South Korea in 2006, and worked in University of Tuebingen in Germany as a postdoc fellow supported by Alexander von Humboldt-Foundation from 2007 to 2009. She has worked in Dalian University of Technology (DUT) in China from 1998-2012, and was promoted to full professor in 2011 in DUT. She is now working in State Key Laboratory of Microbial Metabolism, School of Life Sciences and Biotechnology at Shanghai Jiao Tong University. Her research work mainly focuses on development of industrial yeasts and filamentous fungi by metabolic engineering and synthetic biology for production of biofuels, biochemicals and enzymes using renewable substrates. She has been the principal investigator (PI) of 11 projects supported by National Scientific Foundation of China and Ministry of Science and Technology in China, and also are the PI of projects in collaboration with industries producing cosmetics and biochemicals. Prof. Zhao has published more than 100 peer-reviewed papers in international journals. She is the editorial board member of Biotechnology Advances, BioDesign Research, Bioresources and Bioprocessing, Journal of Fungi and associate editor of Frontiers in Microbiology in the session of Microbial Physiology and Metabolism. She was awarded "Excellent Talents in the New Century" by Chinese Ministry of Education in 2012, and "Young Asian Biotechnologist Prize" by the Society of Biotechnology, Japan in 2015.
